

Notification of parental deployment form

It is normal for children and young people from Armed Forces families to experience changes in behaviour, and become unsettled at school, when one of their parents goes away for any length of time.

i If your child's school knows that a parent is absent, and what changes to look out for, they will be better able to support the child if they are unsettled.

i Schools are busy places and although you can tell teachers/ school offices verbally, your child is much more likely to get the support they deserve if you give them this information in writing.
