Forces and Me Lunchtime Club

This club takes place every Wednesday which is open to P4 – P7 pupils and is run by Lucy Impey with the support of 5 P7 Forces and Me Leaders who are Josie, Jessica, Eilidh, Lexie and Lucy (not pictured). They also have a notice board in the main hall for all children, visitors, parents and staff to view.

Storytime Club

Storytime Club will be starting after the Easter break for P1 – P3 pupils and will be run by Lucy Impey, Madeline Paton and supported by the Forces and Me Leaders.

Armed Forces Pupil Council Ambassadors

Amos and Paige from P6 are the Armed Forces Pupil Ambassadors on the school council.

Amos said **"I feel like I can make a difference on the school** council as I am in a forces family and represent these families."













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Armed Forces Staff Representatives

The school have 2 Armed Forces Representatives – they are a link between the school and Armed Forces Community.

Lucy Impey - My husband has served in the Royal Navy for over 22 years and is currently working on the V class submarines. I have 2 grown up sons, we have moved with the forces several times. I have worked at Hermitage Primary for the last 7 years and started the group 2 years ago because I felt that the military children of Hermitage Primary School needed a place to discuss their experiences and receive support from peers and adults. The Club is continually developing, with new ideas added each term. I recently created the noticeboard in school. The newsletter will be shared from February. I are hoping to start a Primary 1,2,3 Storytime club after the Easter Holidays.

Madeline Paton – I am the Health and Wellbeing Family Liaison Officer at Hermitage Primary and I am honoured to be an Armed Forces Rep. We at Hermitage want to strive to help these families who are experiencing longer deployments and who go through so many transitions in their life's whilst in the Armed Forces and then after too. The beginning of the Forces and Me Club was one of my happiest times for Armed Forces Families as it gave the children the beginning of their much deserved and needed voice within the school community. We are also offering our children a morning toast club which provides a free healthy breakfast for all pupils before the school day begins. We were fortunate to have received some funding for this by Naval Children's Charity.

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Never Such Innocence



Never Such Innocence visited Hermitage Primary twice in 2023 where pupils were invited to engage with the HMS Oardacious mission through poetry and art facilitated by practitioners Nik Perring and Emily Hopkins. The pupils produced work which showed the varying emotions of having a relative deployed, the pride, the strength and struggles one might face alone and together at sea for 35 days. Their work can be viewed at the Drumfork Community Centre.

HMS Oardacious is a group of 4 Royal Navy submariners who rowed 3000 miles from the Canary Islands to Antigua & Barbuda in 35 days in January 2023. The submariners rowed the Atlantic to fundraise for the wellbeing, mental health and welfare of all Submariners, serving and retired, and their families.

Marianne Docherty (Head Teacher), Madeline Paton and some children from the school have been invited to attended Never Such Innocence's 10 Year Anniversary Celebration taking place on 29th February in the Great Hall at Edinburgh Castle.





Forces Children Scotland

Victoria Allan and Nina Collins from Forces Children Scotland have been visiting 10 pupils from Primary 6 and 7. They have been developing a cartoon that describes their experiences as a forces child, this will be shared with schools and non-forces children so there is a greater understanding of their experiences.

Month of the Military Child

Some children from Hermitage Primary took part in the Argyll & Bute Council Month of the Military Child 2023 Competition where they produced some fabulous poetry and artwork which can be viewed at the Drumfork Community Centre.

Beth Culverhouse received 3rd place in the Best Poetry Category. Well done Beth.

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Forces & Me Clubs



These Clubs are held in schools across Helensburgh & Lomond either as a lunchtime or after school club to support the Armed Forces children and young people.

Evidence indicates that children and young people from Armed Forces families may suffer high levels of emotional distress before, during and after deployment of a relative and learning can be interrupted during the

transition process which sometimes can involve more than one change of school during the pivotal primary years.

The aim of the club is to support the children and young people as follows:-

- A safe space to hang out and have lunch
- New to the area/school and looking to make new friends
- Looking for support when a parent is deployed, about to be deployment or just back.
