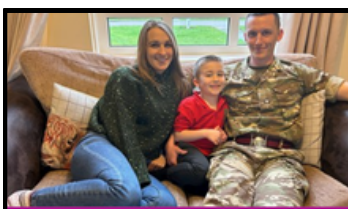


CPD For School Staff

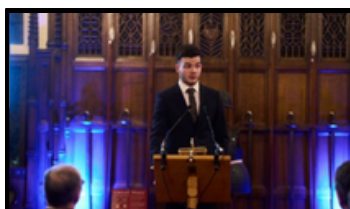

MORAY PUPILS AMAZED AUDIENCE AT A 10TH ANNIVERSARY EVENT

→ NSI'S 10TH ANNIVERSARY EVENT

On Thursday, February 29th, three pupils from Moray were invited to participate in the celebration of Never Such Innocence's (NSI) 10th Anniversary event. Alfie, a student from Elgin Academy and an NSI ambassador, delivered a moving speech. He shared about the support he provided at his previous school with a friend and his experiences as a child from an armed forces family. Alfie emphasised the importance of children and young people having a voice. Additionally, Lily and Rhianna, pupils from Lossiemouth High School, sang a moving performance of 'Welcome Home'. This song was written by two armed forces pupils to capture the feelings of armed forces families; it won first place in the 2020/21 Never Such Innocence International Competition.

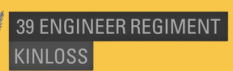




FUNDING OPPORTUNITY

NEW FUNDING PROGRAMME | APPLY BY 8 MAY 2024

In England, each armed forces pupil receives Service Pupil Premium (SPP), £335 (for 23/24). This includes children from veteran families for up to 6 years (supported by the Ever 6 initiative). SPP is only applicable to schools in England.

A new Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust programme is now open for applications. It provides a fantastic opportunity for schools in Scotland to apply for funding to directly help their armed forces pupils. Previously, successful applications from schools in Moray have enabled them to employ a Pupil Support Worker for 12 months, to support the armed forces pupils in their school. Read more below about what is available, how to apply and the criteria.

Service Pupil Support Programme

Your project must meet one of these three themes

Closing the gap


Closing the gap in educational attainment between Service pupils and non-Service pupils, using data-led evidence.


Service Pupils with additional needs


Addressing the needs of Service pupils with additional needs, through early identification and intervention, using a collaborative and coordinated approach.

Small cohorts

Identifying and addressing the needs of small cohorts of Service children in individual schools and working collaboratively as part of a cluster.

 Your project needs to deliver tangible outcomes.

 Your project can last up to two years in length.

 Your project should be collaborative.

Under all of the above themes, we will prioritise applications from clusters of 3 or more schools.
