Forces and Me Lunchtime Clubs run in various schools across Helensburgh & Lomond, offering a supportive space for children and young people from Armed Forces families.




The clubs are designed to support pupils who may:

- Be experiencing a parental deployment or separation
- Be new to the school and looking to make new friends
- Want general support and to connect with others in similar situations

These clubs offer:

- A safe, welcoming space to talk with understanding adults
- Peer support helping young people realise they're not alone

The Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust

Argyll & Bute Council were successful in their bid to the Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust: Service Pupil Support Programme and have been awarded funding (which is split into 2 projects) to support Armed Forces children and young people from serving families in our schools over a 2 year period.

Project 1 - Wellbeing, Literacy or Numeracy Sessions

We are delighted to announce that the organisation to provide this project is:-

The Exchange/Health is One

Sessions will start soon in Rhu Primary and Hermitage Primary as follows:-

- 2 days per week Wednesday and Thursday with two 1 hour group sessions per day
- Each group could consist of up to 10 children or a smaller ASN group of up to 4 children.
- Open to children who have a parent currently serving in the Armed Forces either regular or reserve.

There are three different strands to this project, they can either provide wellbeing, literacy or numeracy sessions and have the qualified staff to provide all three.

Wellbeing

This program is to support Armed Forces children who are separated from family members due to deployment or are struggling emotionally and/or are new to the school/area. Sessions could consist of how to handle worries/anxiety, separation from loved ones, regulating emotions and fostering friendships, confidence and self-worth.

A Wellbeing Holiday Club will also be offered which will provide a safe outlet during the holidays.

Literacy/Numeracy

These sessions are ideal for children who are not making academic progress, have plateaued in their learning, have been identified as not reaching their potential in literacy or numeracy or have just moved to the area and have gaps in their learning.

Woodlandwise Forest School

Sessions will be starting in Hermitage Academy and Colgrain Primary as follows:-

- 1 day per week two 1½ hour group sessions a day
- Each group could consist of up to 10 children or a smaller ASN group of up to 4 children.
- Open to children who have a parent currently serving in the Armed Forces either regular or reserve.

Forest School sessions will also be offered during the holidays which will provide a safe outlet to deepen a sense of belonging, acceptance and fun while developing an understanding of life's challenges and opportunities and how to thrive in both.
